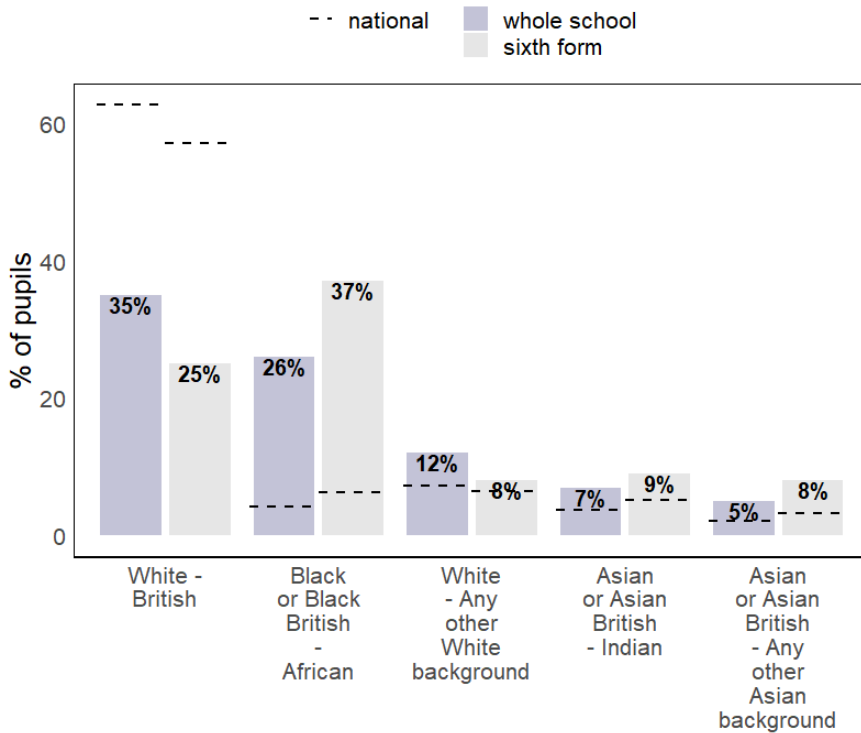

Comparison to schools with a similar level of deprivation

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- Of the 75 pupils in the whole school with 1 or more suspensions in 2021/22, 43% were suspended on 2 or more occasions and 1.3% received 10 or more suspensions during the year.
- Of the 166 suspensions in the whole school in 2021/22, the following reasons each accounted for more than 10%: **persistent disruptive behaviour** (100), physical assault against a pupil (30).
- There were 4 permanent exclusions in the whole school in 2021/22. The national average for this year was 2. There were also 3 in 2020/21 and 2 in 2019/20.
- The 4 permanent exclusions in the whole school in 2021/22 were for: **drug or alcohol related** (2), persistent disruptive behaviour (1), use or threat of use of an offensive weapon or prohibited item (1).

## 16 to 18

- There was 1 student at 16 to 18 with 1 or more suspensions in 2021/22. The national average for this year was 1. There were also 6 in 2020/21 but none in 2019/20.
- The 1 suspension at 16 to 18 in 2021/22 was for **physical assault against a pupil**.
- There were no permanent exclusions at 16 to 18 in 2021/22. The national average for this year was close to zero. There were no permanent exclusions in the previous two years either.

## Subject entries at key stage 4



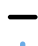


- The EBacc entry rate in this school in 2023 was 32%. Languages had the lowest entry rate of EBacc subject areas (33%).
