



Staffing

- Per pupil spending was in the lowest 20% of similar schools in 2021/22 for: Agency supply teaching staff, Teaching staff.
- There is nothing to highlight for teachers with at least one period of sickness absence in 2021/22 or 2020/21.
- 1 day on average was lost to teacher sickness absence in 2021/22. This was in the lowest 20% nationally.
- At the time of the November 2022 census, there were no full-time vacant teacher posts in the school.
- There is nothing to highlight for staff turnover in 2021, 2020 or 2019.

- Of the 4 pupils in the whole school with 1 or more suspensions in 2021/22, 1 was suspended on 2 or more occasions and none received 10 or more suspensions during the year.
- Of the 5 suspensions in the whole school in 2021/22, all were for persistent disruptive behaviour.
- There were no permanent exclusions in the whole school in 2021/22. The national average for this year was close to zero. There were no permanent exclusions in the previous two years either.
